## References

#### **Record Sources Consulted**

The following is a list of the principal sources used in the compilation of this book. Actual source details are not necessarily included in the book but are held by the author in a separate reference collection.

#### 1 - Alehouse Recognisances from 1764 to 1819

Each entry in the original licensing books gave the name of the premises, its address by parish, the alehouse keeper and who his or her sureties were. Therefore, if a date of 1764 is given as an earliest date for a house, it is quite probable that it is much older than that date, but that no earlier reference has been found to it. The earlier books have survived but are of no practical use as they do not give names of houses.

#### 2 - Licences from 1872 to date

The records from 1820 to 1871 have been lost or destroyed, thus producing a gap of some 51 years from the earlier alehouse recognisance series. These records give the names of the premises, the owner of the premises (usually a brewery), the name of the licence holder, the dates of renewal or transfer of the licence, and sometimes a comment about the premises changing its name or ceasing trading for some reason. There are also references to breaches of the licensing law, such as selling alcohol to minors, allowing drunkeness, selling alcohol out of licensing hours, and the like.

Specific references to the popular names used by beerhouses with 'on' licences did not occur in these records until 1907. Before that time, the premises were only mentioned by licence holder and the address. Therefore, it is difficult to pinpoint individual beerhouses such as the Baker's Arms, Gardener's Arms, Stockwell Arms, etc. before 1907. Other records are relied on to provide this information.

NB. If a date of 1872 is given as an earliest date for a house, it is highly probable that the house is older than that date, but that no earlier reference has been found to it.

#### 3 - Trade Directories

A good collection of these directories are held in the Essex Record Office and the Local Studies section of the Colchester Library, dating from 1784 to 1950. The most useful ones are White's Directories, which have a separate section for Inns, Alehouses, etc., listing the names, the keeper and the address.

The main directories consulted are as follows:

Bailey's British Directories of 1784, 1791, 1827 Pigot a Co's Directories of 1823\*, 1832 White's Directories of 1848\*, 1863\*

Kelly's Directories of 1866, 1870, 1878, 1890, 1902, 1926, 1929, 1933, 1937, etc.

This set of records is particularly useful for filling in the gaps in a pub's history between 1820 and 1871, the years from when licensing records have been lost.

\* As examples, facsimile copies from 1823, 1848 and 1863 directories are included in the index section.

#### 4 - Telephone Directories

This is a modern source of information for the names and locations of pubs.

#### 5 - Deposited deeds, building plans, etc.

There are many assorted records such as deeds of sale, plan drawings accompanying applications to build or alter a building, etc. that have survived.

Building plans give the date and the name of the owner of the premises (where given). These can show what a house that has since been demolished, once looked like, or what a current house which has been altered over the years once looked like.

With the introduction of the Land Registry Act in the 20th century, the need for deeds, which often recorded the complete history of a property, became unnecessary. Many were destroyed, or ended up for sale at 'Car Boot Sales' - but thankfully many were preserved in record offices. Some have even been discovered in long forgotten crevices in old buildings. They can give a variety of information covering what the property comprised, where it was located, by whom owned and when a property was sold or transferred. They can date back several hundred years.

#### 6 - Newspapers

Our local newspapers have reported much of the history of our pubs over the years, especially because they love a scandal or to publicise the misfortune of others. The German word 'schadenfreude' (loosely, the enjoyment of the misfortune of others) is used today to describe something that is unique to the human race - and to newspaper publishers particularly!

The Colchester Public Library has a series of microfilmed newspapers, the paper quality of the originals being of a very poor quality and with a short life. They provide a wealth of information about day to day life and have been an invaluable source of information for this book.

Newspapers which have yielded information for this book are as follows:

The Colchester Express, The Colchester Gazette, The East Anglian Daily Times, The Essex County Standard, The Essex County Telegraph, The Evening Gazette, The Ipswich Journal (mainly 18th century), The Yellow Advertiser.

There was a series of articles published in the Colchester Gazette in the 1960's covering the visits of Bacchus (alias Mr Norman Woodland, now deceased) to somewhere around 100 pubs in the general area. They proved to be a fascinating snapshot in time, revealing information that would otherwise have been lost to us.

#### 7 - Oral History

So much information about pubs comes from oral history. The old boys (and girls) sitting in their spot at the end of the bar or in the corner by the fire, can tell tales of pubs past and present, that you would never find written down anywhere.

There is a local history project being undertaken entitled 'Colchester Recalled', whereby memories of our older members of the community are being recorded on magnetic tape. This book has preserved a lot of this oral history, their tales still to be enjoyed, long after the old boys (and girls) have taken their last drink on this earth.

#### 8 - Maps

The large scale 1876 (1:500) Ordnance Survey map of Colchester is an excellent means of locating a pub that existed at that time. It very accurately shows the plan shape of the building, its outbuildings and the neighbouring properties. It was made at a period in Colchester's history when there was much building work going on, the garrison was well established, but the urban areas now known as New Town, Prettygate, Monkwick, Shrub End, Greenstead, were non-existant. Most of the town, as it was then, is shown and extracts from it are used extensively throughout this book. It is the masterful work of a master map maker.

There are many other Ordnance Survey maps that were published after the large scale 1876 series although, with some noteable exceptions, they are of a smaller scale and with less information given. They show how the town grew up over the years, up until modern times.

Tithe maps from around the 1845 period are of a smaller scale and consequently not of any great detail. However, they often identify the locations of long forgotten pubs, especially as their date fits perfectly with the missing years of the licensing records. There are no particularly useful maps earlier than the tithe maps, other than perhaps town plans which highlight the better known inns.

Another interesting and useful set of maps are insurance plans of the town, which are dated from 1909 and record the type of use of the premises, what the building was made of from a point of view of combustability (and therefore risk) and identifies public houses which are often not identifiable from other maps.

#### 9 - The Museum Collection

Colchester Museum holds a card index with many references to pubs. With the kind assistance of the museum's staff, all of the relevant cards were consulted and much of the information given extracted. It appears that the card index was compiled from around 1920 through to 1940, by the archivist of the time, who seemed to have a good knowledge of the town's pubs. Some of his personal comments are gems in themselves, if not a little outrageous.

It also holds a massive collection of Victorian and Edwardian photographs of the town, and many paintings done by various artists. Some of these photographs and pictures are included in this book with the kind permission of the museum authorities.

#### 10 - Reference or Local History Books

There are many books which have been written about Colchester's history, many of them being collections of old photographs. Few make anything more than scant reference to pubs, but some interesting references have been extracted, nonetheless.

Probably the most outstanding book consulted is that written by the Reverend Philip Morant and published in 1748. He was Rector of St Mary at the Walls from 1738 to 1770 and wrote what has been described as the greatest work on Colchester's history. It has yielded many references to alehouses that have long since been forgotten and which otherwise would not have been recorded.

#### 11 - Diaries

William Wire, watchmaker and postman of Colchester, and son of a Colchester publican, left us his diary which was written between 1842 and 1857. In it he made observations and comments of happenings which took place in Colchester during this period. He mentions many of the Colchester pubs, often in less than complimentary terms. He deplored the effect that drink had, especially on the working classes.

Many of his observations mention the names of pubs as landmarks to give an indication of where an incident took place. In 1847 he mentioned the increase in price of London porter from 2d to 2½d, whereby people stopped drinking it, thus resulting in the price being lowered again. He mentioned in 1856 how the Royal Essex Rifles were billeted at different public houses in the town. He mentions in the same year the siting of letter boxes outside the Plough and the King's Arms. He noted the importance of the Cups Hotel as a meeting place for various gatherings of persons to discuss differing subjects.

#### 12 - Census

The Government holds a census of the population of Great Britain every ten years. The earliest available that is of any real use to us is for 1841, although it gives limited details about individuals and does not identify the names of the houses. The 1851, 1861, 1871, 1881, 1891, 1901 and 1911 censuses, give more information about occupants and name most of the houses and have all been consulted. Due to the difficulties for researchers in way the 1911 census was presented in 2012, this source has not been used to any large extent for this edition of the book. However, this census will have been fully indexed during 2012 and will be of better use when compiling the next edition of this book – should there ever be one.

The names of public houses are given in most instances, but not in every instance. Where the names are given, they are sometimes in a different hand, suggesting that the note was added at a later date. Therefore, if a pub is not shown, it does not necessarily mean that it did not exist, but simply that it was not recorded as being a pub by the enumerator, whose task was head counting - not public house recording! In some cases we have been able to deduce the name of the pub from the address or the continuity of the surname, together with the profession given.

The census is very useful for locating pubs relative to other pubs or special buildings. For instance, The Crown and Punch Bowl is shown as six households along from the Rose and Crown, on the 1851 census. The only

reference found to the Earl of Derby public house is shown in the 1871 census with it being located within two households of Winsleys's Almshouses. Its precise location remains a mystery.

#### 13 - Local Society Publications

Various publications from this source have been consulted, typically from such organisations as the Colchester Archaeological Group, the Colchester Civic Society, etc. The Essex Review has also been quoted from in several instances.

#### 14 - Private Collections and Assorted Miscellaneous Items

This includes records that have been found from:

A scrapbook of Colchester from 1648 to 1840, held in the local studies section of Colchester Library and probably compiled by Isaac Rebow. Many of the items in the book concern marriages of well to do people, references to robberies by footpads, archaeological matters and many references to the Cups Hotel, which was perhaps much frequented by the compiler.

The Laver papers which are held at the Essex Record Office.

The Rickword papers were compiled by Mr Gerald Rickword. He collected many references to public houses and wrote many articles which were published in various publications. The bulk of his material dates from around 1915 to 1964. His father, George Rickword also wrote several items of relevance to this book's subject. There are many references to the Cups, the George, the Red Lion and the White Hart.

#### 15 - Parish Registers

Typical references gleaned from this source are mentioned in baptisms, marriages and burials.

#### 16 - Pictures and Photographs

Most of the pictures found in this book have come from the Colchester Museum collection. Others have come from private collections or trade directories and newspapers.

The earliest pictures date from around 1780, being mainly paintings or sketches by one of the Dunthornes. The father and son artists, both James Dunthorne, attained some amount of reputation, although their names are now little known, and most of their paintings and engravings have not survived to the present time. James Dunthorne the elder, was born in 1730 and died in Colchester on Boxing Day, 1815, at the age of 85 years. Little is known of James Dunthorne the younger and it is assumed, from the dates of his work, that he was born around 1758 and died around 1792. The Colchester Dunthorne artists are not to be confused with the father and son John Dunthornes of East Bergholt, also artists of some note, and intimate friends of the celebrated painter John Constable, RA.

Major John Edward Bale FRIBA (1837 to 1913) painted many views of the town from c1880 onwards and many of his pictures have been used to illustrate this book. In certain instances, he seems to have copied much earlier pictures, perhaps those of now lost works, an early view of an almost unrecognisable Rose and Crown being a typical example. He had a distinguished military career, joining the West India regiment in October 1863 and becoming a Major in 1881, retiring that same year and settling in Colchester. He published articles on architecture and made a large series of watercolours and wash drawings of Colchester and the surrounding district.

Photographs started to appear in the 1850's and many of these are used as illustrations. The high quality of the cameras then used, requiring large lenses and long exposures, meant that picture sharpness was so good as to enable the writing on windows and signs to be read, therefore enabling us to add even further to our knowledge of a pub's history.

Picture postcards were popular around a century ago as a means of easy communication. Many of these showed local scenes and modern day postcard collectors have proved to be a good source for old pub pictures. The author also has an extensive collection of Colchester postcards that includes its pubs, several of which are used in this book.

The author also has an extensive collection of modern day photographs of Colchester's pubs and their signs; some of which have been used in this book (but many that have not). In particular he photographed every pub and its sign in the census year of 1991, and then again in 2011. With the loss of so many pubs since 1991, they have become an invaluable historical record.

#### 17 - The Internet

We were not able to make use of this incredible source of information for the first edition of this book. But, of course, this edition of the book has made extensive use of all manner of web sites, especially Ancestry, Google, Wikipedia, SEAX, Dead Pubs, etc. SEAX especially has been of great help with Essex records, as has Ancestry with its on-line census records. The Dead Pubs site made access to Pubby Hunter, and his indexing colleagues' work, very easy for us to cross check and enhance our own records. Where relevant, we have given the source of our information.

## Your Local - by Bacchus

Articles about each of the following pubs were featured in the Colchester Express during 1962, 1963 and 1964. Bacchus was the 'nom de plume' of journalist, Mr Norman Woodland (deceased), who had the enviable paid task of visiting all these establishments and then writing about them.

After contacting Mr Woodland in 1992, these fascinating articles were rediscovered and recorded by the author. They describe a way of life that was so familiar to northeast Essex folk, almost 40 years ago. Much of the information that was contained within the articles would otherwise have been lost to us. Mr Woodland died in December 1995 at the age of 84.

This index is included as a source of further information for interested persons. It is regrettable that the quality of the reproduction of the film held at the Colchester Library, Local Studies Section, was too poor to enable use in this book. The author has poor copies in his collection. If they are still there when you are reading this, a visit to the aforementioned library is therefore to be recommended.

Most of the articles were concerned with Colchester pubs although several dealt with pubs from surrounding areas. All of the articles are listed below.

#### The Inns, Taverns and Pubs of North-East Essex.

Enthused by the fascinating facts that I had uncovered whilst researching this book, I thought that it would be a good idea to expand the work, further afield, to produce a work on the Inns, Taverns and Pubs of North-East Essex. It soon became clear that the extent of the work was immense, especially when one considered the pubs that existed in Harwich, not forgetting Manningtree, Brightlingsea, Wivenhoe, etc.

I have collected quite a bit of information but feel that I am unlikely to complete the work to a satisfactory standard within the foreseeable future, if at all. My main interest is in Colchester's history and, for this reason, I am publishing here a simple listing of the houses that I have so far discovered, mainly from licensing records. This may assist others who have a wish to delve further. These pubs are all within the CO (Colchester) postcode range.

Having said this, I feel that some notes of explanation are necessary.

1. Like Colchester's records, alehouse licensing records are incomplete. Those that have been consulted are held at the ERO Chelmsford from 1769 to 1826 and, after that period, as follows:

Lexden and Winstree - from 1911 to date

Tendring - from 1894 to date

Harwich - from 1872 to date

Brightlingsea - none seen before 1911 as the early series would have been controlled by the Cinque Port authorities in Kent.

- 2. Gaps in Licensing. Where I have shown licences from say 1911 to 1939, then a gap, then more from 1950 to 1961, this simply means that those are the only licences that I have seen, not that the houses were un-licenced during the intervening years. A gap from say 1826 to 1911 is due to the non-existence of licensing records, presumed destroyed. The gap years can be explored using trade directories and census returns, as well as a myriad of other records.
- 3. Other information. I do have a collection of miscellaneous items, including photographs, much of which refers to some of these houses, and I shall be adding-to this during the following years.

Frinton was little more than a hamlet up until the property developers moved-in in the last half of the 19th century. The 1851 census shows five households made up of three farmers of 250, 153 and 38 acres respectively, a farmer's son and a farm labourer and his family. A total of 31 people. The 1861 census gives a population of just 29.

Frinton had one of the smallest churches in the country. With the coming of the railway in 1867, the area was steadily developed. There were and are no pubs in Frinton, the Essex Skipper being outside the gates, that oh so important boundary marker.

Whilst there were no pubs as such, there were several alehouse licences granted to hotel keepers.
